

## RESOLUTION

### CHILD ABUSE/NEGLECT

- Whereas, The National PTA survey of units for legislative priorities listed child abuse as the number one concern; and
- Whereas, The term "child abuse" includes the physical or mental injury, sexual abuse, negligent treatment or maltreatment of a child under the age of 18, by a person who is responsible for the child's welfare; and
- Whereas, many children who suffer from abuse need specialized treatment due to the trauma experienced; and
- Whereas, The families involved in the child abuse offenses need specialized counseling and rehabilitation to reduce repeat offenses; and
- Whereas, Many children who are abused, sexually or otherwise, tend to become child abusers themselves; and
- Whereas, Many more children will be helped when citizens become aware of existing agencies with programs for abused children and their parents; now therefore be it
- Resolved, That the Delaware State PTA urge its PTAs/PTSAs at all organizational levels to support the development of preventive programs and treatment programs for both the victims and their families; and be it further
- Resolved, That the Delaware State PTA urge its PTAs/PTSAs to cooperate in the development of community awareness programs dealing with early detection and the effects of child abuse/neglect.
