

RESOLUTION

COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY

- Whereas, The PTA recognizes that familiarity with computer technology increasingly is a prerequisite for effective participation in an information-oriented society; and
- Whereas, Understanding and using computers must be included in children's education, as computer technology will be an integral part of their lives as well as of their careers; and
- Whereas, The Delaware State PTA believes that in an age of technology all students should have equal access to computer literacy training that prepares them to become productive members of society; and
- Whereas, Many school districts and concerned citizens are under pressure to make hasty purchases before a comprehensive plan is developed or teacher training is initiated; now therefore be it
- Resolved, That the Delaware State PTA encourage state and local governments and legislative bodies to support, with adequate funding, the implementation of teaching technology in the public schools; and be it further
- Resolved, That the Delaware State PTA and its constituent organizations encourage state departments of education and local school districts to include, as an essential element of a well-balanced curriculum, a comprehensive sequential K – 12 computer education plan; and be it further
- Resolved, That the Delaware State PTA encourage state agencies and local school districts to provide teacher training before computer education is implemented in the classroom; and be it further
- Resolved, That the Delaware State PTA urge its constituent organizations to take a leadership role in facilitating the overall planning process by working with the school districts to involve parents and community in the development and implementation of such a long-range educational technology plan.
